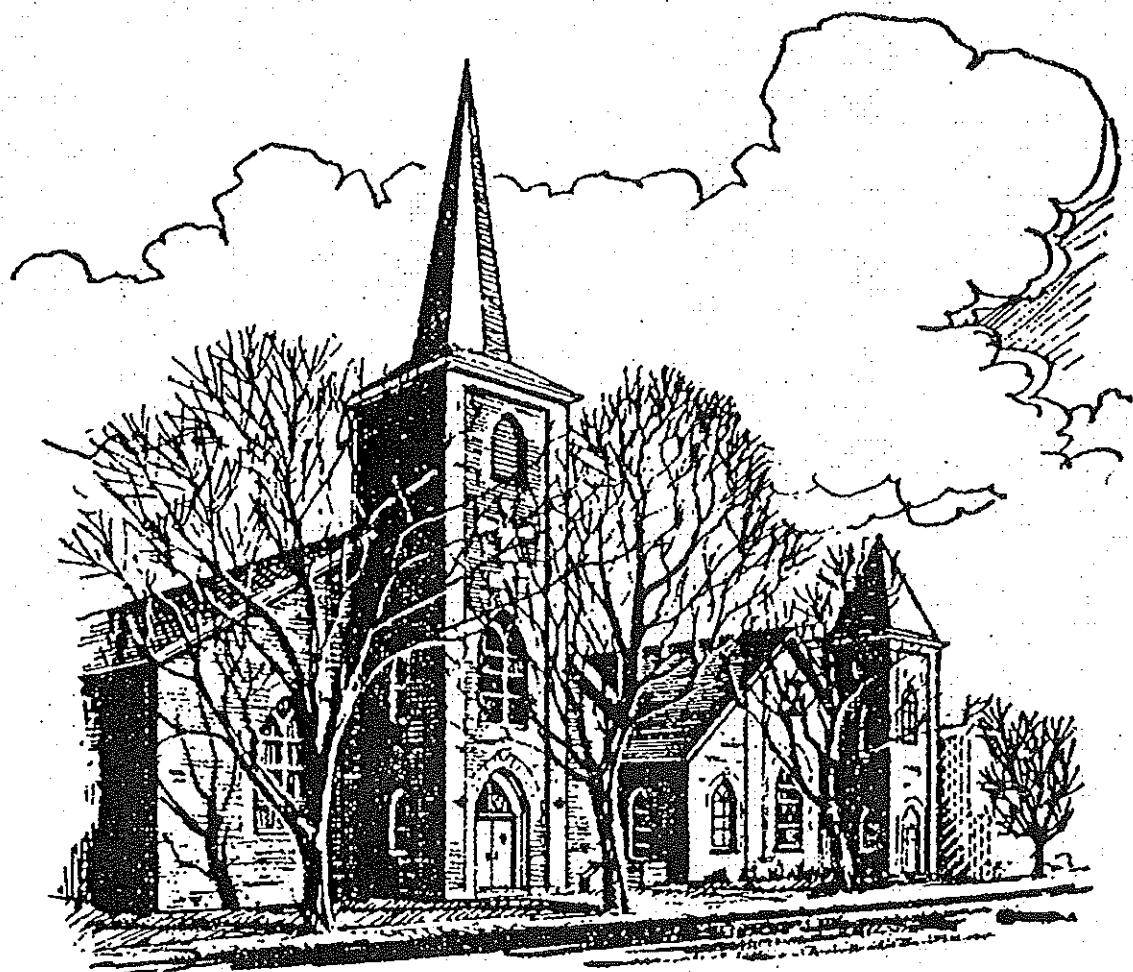

FROM THE PASTOR....

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.” John 1:1-5

Yes my friends, once more it is that time of year when we prepare again to meet the Lord! December is upon us and we are preparing for the great celebration of something that happened over 2,000 years ago. It is a time when we find our schedules have become more cluttered and filled to overflowing. In the middle of all the preparations for our celebrations and gift giving extravaganza, it is easy to lose sight of the real importance of Christmas.

Many hours will be spent in putting up the Christmas tree. Perhaps it will start with a trip to find the perfect tree for your home. The tree needs to be put into the tree stand before the lights and decorations can be added. Many families will spend hours on this venerable tradition, as they will also add other decorations inside and outside of their

homes. Does your family put up outdoor Christmas lights? Do you place candles in the window to give off that warm Christmas glow to your home for all passersby? I applaud and encourage all efforts to make the Christmas holiday a festive and joyous one. I am second to none in my excitement over the tree and other decorations! And yet, these have very little meaning for any of us if we do not understand why we do them. All of these things must remind us of the Lord! All of them must point to the babe in the manger that will grow up to save all of us from an eternal separation from God.

I love placing the candles in the windows each Christmas season as it reminds me of the light that Jesus brings to the darkness. Christmas arrives for us during the time of year when the daylight hours are few and the nights are long, dark and cold. We place candles in the window as a visible sign of the light the baby in the manger will bring to all of humanity. They remind any passerby that the darkness will not overtake our home. The little lights upon our Christmas tree act in much the same way. It was said that when Dr. Luther cut the first fir tree and took it inside to remind his family of the life that is present even in the dark winter months, he put candles on the boughs to remind them of the stars that shine through the winter darkness. The stars remind us too that God is present in our lives, both during the good and bad times. His light is there, and the darkness, even though it sometimes unbelievably thick, can not compete with the light of Jesus Christ.

As I wish all you a very Merry Christmas, my prayer is to keep the Lord at the center of all we do. May we make sure that the gift which concerns us most is the gift of Jesus- the extraordinary gift God gives us. May we keep His light burning brightly to banish the darkness from all our lives. Of course I would be remiss not to encourage you to mark your calendar for the many fellowship opportunities we have for this Christmas season. We have a special activity each week for Advent. We are offering our worship and Praise Christmas celebration at 5:00 pm on Saturday, December 17th. We will also offer 3 times for worship on Christmas Eve: 3:30 pm, 7:00 pm, and 11:00pm.

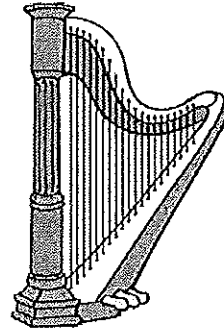

Women's Bible Study

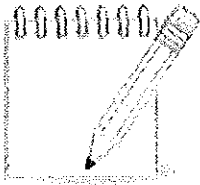

Health and Wellness

With the recent time change and the days getting shorter, it is often common to feel sad. For some people this feeling gets worse throughout the season and can cause serious behavioral problems. This is known as Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) which shares many symptoms with depression including:

- Depressed mood
- Hopelessness
- Loss of energy and motivation
- Social withdrawal
- Difficulty concentrating
- Craving for complex carbohydrates-leading to weight gain

How does SAD occur?

- The change in exposure to natural light has an impact on:
 - Circadian rhythms that control our sleep/ wake cycle
 - Melatonin levels
 - Serotonin --a chemical linked to depression

Women who have a family history of depressive problems and also who live greater distances from the equator are most at risk.

How does SAD affect my life?

These behavioral symptoms can impact school, work and relationships negatively. Some people with SAD may even have thoughts of suicide. There tends to be an increase in substance abuse for those with SAD as they try to cope inappropriately with the symptoms.

How do I know if I have SAD?

There are no medical tests available for SAD. However, your doctor, nurse or behavioral health provider can assess for this problem by asking questions about mood changes, thoughts and behaviors, sleeping and eating patterns, life style and social situations.

Cont'd →

How do I prevent or treat SAD?

There is no way to prevent SAD but sitting closer to windows, getting outside even on the coldest and cloudiest days and regular physical exercise to improve overall health and reduce stress can help to keep SAD symptoms from worsening. Even if you don't suffer from SAD, these things will help improve your overall functioning through the months of the year when we experience less sunlight.

If you do have SAD, your doctor may suggest a combination of treatments including light therapy, antidepressant medication, and/or counseling to help minimize the symptoms.

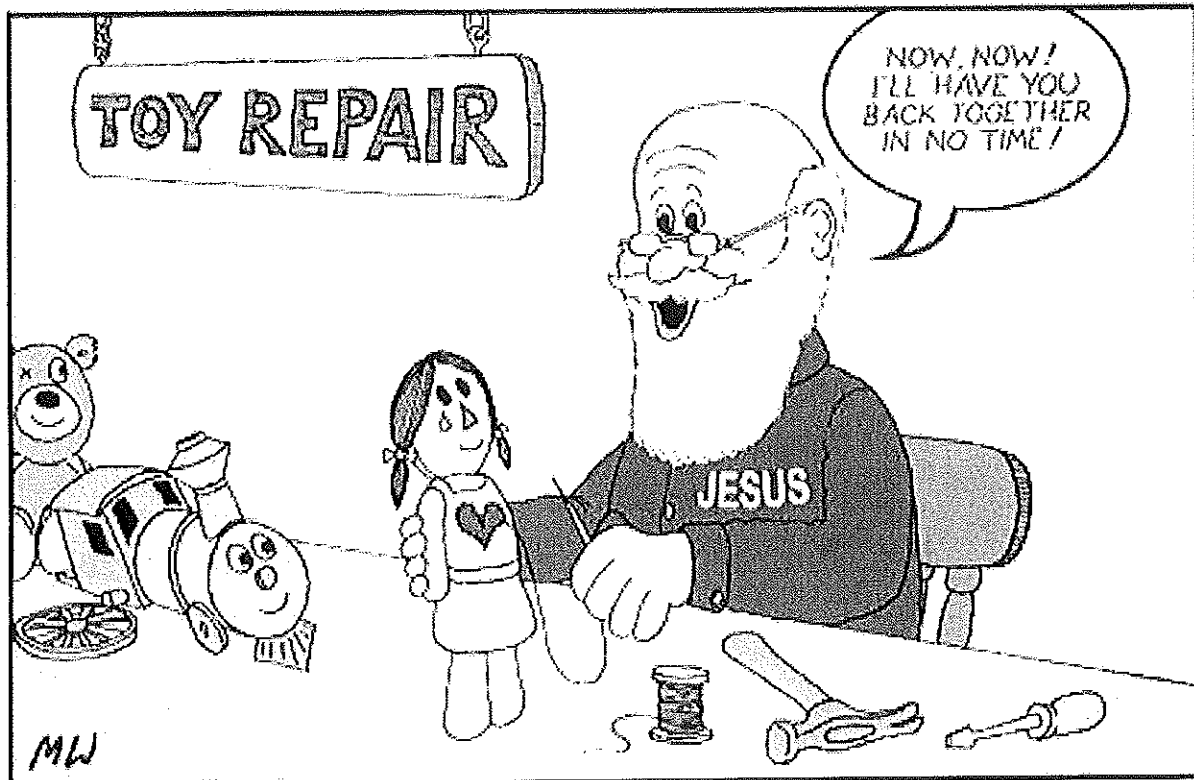

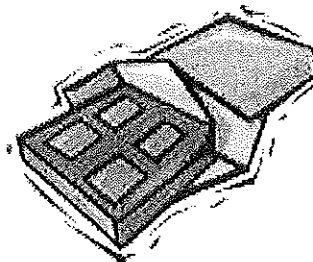
With everyone's help, the kitchen will look as beautiful as it does now, for a very long time.

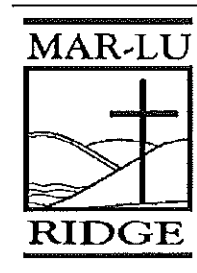
